Mazomanie, WI--Friday, May 21, 2021--The Performing Arts Pavilion in the Westland Promenade, designed by the School of Architecture at Taliesin is finally open for a summer season of Music, shows and many performing arts. After its construction in January 2020, it was silenced due to the Covid pandemic. Now with the reopening of Dane County, organizers have assembled a summer of first class entertainment.
